Ms. Barnhart teaches voice in her Southington studio and is Director of the Handbell Choir at the First United Methodist Church. Ms. Barnhart studies singing with professional soloist and master teacher, Beverly Myers, in New York City.

Stacy Cahoon received her Master of Music Degree in Piano Accompanying from the Hartt School of Music and a Bachelor of Music in Performance from the University of Massachusetts at Lowell. The Travelers Choral Club was formed in 1924 and is the oldest company-sponsored, mixed singing group in the United States. Starting out as a small ensemble, the Club performed in the company's auditorium. In 1931, the group appeared at the newly opened Bushnell Auditorium and has performed annually in Mortensen Hall ever since. During the 1930's, 1940's and 1950's the group sang live Christmas carols on radio station WTIC, then owned by The Travelers.
